

FIRST AID

Including CPR and Defibrillation

First Response Australia Pty Ltd is the Registered Training Organisation (No. 5919) offering this course.

Under a third-party agreement, Highpoint Access & Rescue will be delivering the training and assessment.



This course is designed for participants wishing to attain a qualification to meet Health and Safety requirements where emergency care response is a duty of care. This qualification can also be utilised by all community members.

This program also includes thorough training and assessment relating to the use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

Entry Requirements: Nil

USI: A Unique Student Identifier (USI) number is required for all accredited training in Australia. If you do not provide a USI number the RTO, First Response Australia, may not be able to issue a Statement of Attainment upon successful completion of training.

Competencies Gained:

- HLTAID001 Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation;
- HLTAID002 Provide basic emergency life support;
- HLTAID003 Provide First Aid.

Course Duration: 8 Hours (face to face)

Assessment will include: Written/oral questions, practical assessments and scenario-based assessments.

Reasonable Adjustment: Highpoint supports learners with recognised disabilities and makes adjustments, where possible, according to each individual's needs. The level of adjustment required is determined on a case by case basis between Highpoint and the learner with a disability. Highpoint ensures any reasonable adjustment does not compromise the integrity of the competency standards.

Certification: Upon successful completion of the program your electronic Statement of Attainment will be emailed to within 30 calendar days (subject to all fees having been paid).

Course Physicality: A level of fitness and stamina is required to complete the practical assessment by spending extended periods of time on your knees at floor level.

Course Content:

- Social and legal considerations;
- First Aid at work;
- Casualty assessment;
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR);
- Use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs);
- Trauma emergencies;
- Medical emergencies;
- Bites, stings and poisons;
- Burns and over exposure;
- Anatomy and physiology;
- Scenario based assessments.

Dress Code: Work attire as per company policy.

Re-certification: The RTO recommends that the units; HLTAID002 Provide basic emergency life support and HLTAID003 Provide first aid, be renewed every 3 years. The CPR component; HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation, is to be renewed every 12 months, as per the Australian Resuscitation Council Guidelines.
